<u>RECRUITMENT OPEN TO</u>: This is an open competitive recruitment, open to all qualified applicants. This position is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the director of the Nevada Department of Agriculture (NDA).

<u>MISSION STATEMENT</u>: The NDA promotes a business climate that is fair, economically viable and encourages environmental stewardship that serves to protect food, fiber and human health and safety through effective service and education.

THE POSITION: The Animal Disease Lab (ADL) supervisor serves under the state veterinarian and is appointed by the director. The ADL supervisor is responsible for the management and planning of day to day operations of the Sparks ADL. This position will supervise two microbiologists in addition to managing some cooperative agreement programs and grants, most specifically Centers for Disease Control and Prevention related programs centered on rabies and arbovirus diseases. The ADL Supervisor is also responsible for conducting testing as needed including, parasitological examinations, serology, microscopy, polymerase chain reaction, culture and sensitivity, etc. as part of diagnostic staff.

POSITION LOCATION: Sparks, Nevada. Sparks/Reno is located at the foothills of the Sierra Nevada, is home to the University of Nevada, Truckee Meadows Community College, and offers a thriving arts scene, big-name entertainment, and a wide variety of recreational activities. Lake Tahoe, Virginia City, and the state capital, Carson City, are all located within a half hour drive. The climate is seasonal; summers are dry and warm with cool evenings; winters are normally cold with a moderate amount of snow and rain. Low taxes and no state income tax add to the desirability of this area.

<u>APPROXIMATE ANNUAL SALARY</u>: Up to \$102,941.00 plus benefits. Please note: The salary range reflects the Public Employees' Retirement System of Nevada contributions by both the employee and employer. An employer paid contribution plan is also available with a reduced gross salary.

TO QUALIFY: Applicants must meet one of the following-

• Have earned either a master's degree in microbiology, molecular biology or other lab related field and have two years of experience in an animal disease diagnostic laboratory or a clinical laboratory setting;

- Or have earned a bachelor's degree and have four years of experience in an animal disease diagnostic laboratory or a clinical laboratory setting;
- Or have earned of a doctor of veterinary medicine degree from an accredited college or university recognized by the American Veterinary Medical Association.

Additional Requirements: The ability to-

- Recognize trends involving the public and animal regulatory diagnostic service requirements in order to initiate adjustment of laboratory diagnostic priorities.
- Utilize the lab's Laboratory Management Information System computer system for submission or reporting purposes.
- Anticipate monthly and annual lab supply needs based upon evaluation of past records and predicted service demands.
- Supervise professional and technical staff and recognize impaired work performance of laboratory staff, distinguish between personnel and technical difficulties, and initiate corrective action.
- Assist with performing diagnostic tests and assist staff with trouble shooting failed test results/outcomes.
- Work cooperatively with the NDA veterinarians in compiling, analyzing, and distributing data needed for animal disease and public health epidemiological investigations.

Desired or Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience with performing molecular diagnostic testing and molecular test development.
- Experience performing serology tests (enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay, agar gel immunodiffusion).
- Knowledge of state and federal animal regulatory programs and activities as they apply to laboratory diagnostic specimens and interstate movement of animals.
