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## Enforcement Agent Nevada Gaming Control Enforcement Division Lateral Entry

This recruitment is for the **Las Vegas** and/or **Reno** locations of the Nevada Gaming Control Board.

The Nevada Gaming Control Board's Enforcement Division is accepting applications for an Enforcement Agent position (lateral entry).

This is a sworn peace officer position with statewide law enforcement authority pursuant to NRS 289.360(2). Enforcement Agents are required to carry firearms and must demonstrate proficiency and safe handling of same on an ongoing basis. Agents will be required to make criminal arrests, appear and testify in court or in regulatory hearings, and write affidavits for arrest and search warrants. In addition, Agents serve search warrants, transport/book prisoners, and conduct extradition of prisoners.

Under immediate or general supervision, an agent receives training and conducts criminal, regulatory, and intelligence investigations into alleged violations of chapters 462, 463, 464, 465, 466, 205, and 207 of NRS and applicable regulations; collects, analyzes, and documents the information obtained; prepares comprehensive reports for the distribution and use of the Nevada Gaming Control Board, the Nevada Gaming Commission, applicable Offices of City/District Attorneys, the Nevada Attorney General's Office, and other authorized agencies; investigates disputes involving gaming activities; ensures regulatory compliance by gaming licensees; develops and operates informants; provides instruction and on-the-job training to new agents; may act as a first-line supervisor of subordinates; completes assigned special projects and administrative duties; and performs related work as required.

The minimum qualifications for the position are:

- Graduation from an accredited college or university with a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice, Administration of Justice, Pre-Law, Business Administration, Public Administration, Accounting, Economics, Finance, Computer Science, or other applicable subject matter;
- An equivalent combination of education and investigative experience involving white collar crime, narcotics trafficking or money laundering, organized crime, intelligence collection, fraud or closely related experience;
- Professional level experience in the areas of accounting, auditing, legal research, business or public administration in a related area, or closely related experience.

Both education and experience can be substituted on a year-for-year basis.

Applicants must possess or be able to attain Nevada Peace Officers Standard and Training (POST) Category 1 Certification within one year of appointment. Submittals from applicants who are active duty (or were active within the past 60 months) or police officers in the United States will be considered.

Note: Applicant must be appointed prior to the expiration of the 60 month period since last employed as a peace officer).

POST reciprocity requirements will have to be fulfilled within one (1) year from date of appointment for candidates that have a peace officer certification from outside Nevada. Non-NV certified lateral applicants must successfully complete POST Academy Entrance Physical Fitness Test pursuant to NAC 289.300(1)(b)(1), which reads as follows:

## NAC 289.300 Basic training courses. (NRS 289.510, 289.590)

- 1. The Executive Director shall certify basic training courses presented by agencies or approved by the Commission which meet the following requirements:
- (b) A person enrolling in the course must be required to pass a physical fitness examination not sooner than 30 days before the commencement of the course and not later than 14 days after the commencement of the course. To pass such a physical fitness examination, the person must:
- (1) For category I and reserve training:
  - (I) Complete a vertical jump of not less than 11.5 inches.
  - (II) Complete not less than 24 sit-ups in 1 minute.
  - (III) Complete not less than 18 push-ups.
  - (IV) Run 300 meters in not more than 1 minute and 22 seconds.
  - (V) Walk or run 1.5 miles in not more than 20 minutes and 20 seconds
  - (VI) Complete an agility run in not more than 23.4 seconds.

These standards must be met prior to interview. Additionally, Non-NV certified lateral applicants must meet 100% of the <u>Minimum Physical Fitness Requirements</u> for a category 1 peace officer within 16 weeks of appointment.

Candidate testing to be completed prior to appointment:

- Successful completion of comprehensive background
- Drug test
- Medical examination by a licensed physician who confirms in writing that no physical conditions exist that would adversely affect the individual's performance as a peace officer
- Lie detector/polygraph exam
- Psychological exam

All positions at the Nevada Gaming Control Board will have access to Criminal Justice Information Systems (CJIS) data.

The starting salary will be contingent upon education and experience, with a salary range of \$49,390-\$75,984 (employee/employer paid retirement) or \$43,324-\$66,652 (employer paid retirement).

All applicants who meet the minimum qualifications are eligible to apply for this position and may do so by completing an application on the Nevada Gaming Control Board website at <a href="https://www.gaming.nv.gov">www.gaming.nv.gov</a>. Only applications submitted through the website will be accepted.

Applications will be accepted until the recruitment is satisfied.
