The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Division of Water Resources, Carson City, Nevada is seeking qualified applicants for the position of Well Supervisor for the Well Drilling Regulation and Adjudications Section of the Nevada Division of Water Resources

Recruitment: This is an open-competitive recruitment, open to all qualified persons. This position is a non-classified, full-time position within Nevada State Government.

The Position: This position assists in the regulation of well drillers through review and approval/rejection of Notice of Intent Cards, Well Driller Reports, Affidavits of Intent to Abandon, and drilling related Waiver letters. Other duties include conducting well driller site inspections, assisting the public and office staff with well drilling and water rights information, map table review, data entry and various office duties as assigned. Additional duties may include field data collection, analysis and database entry and performing groundwater level measurements and stream-flow measurements in various hydrographic basins. Applicants must be able to perform field investigations concerning various water rights and water well related issues as assigned. This position will have some daily and overnight travel.

Skills Required: Must be able to work independently with minimal supervision as well as in a team environment in collaboration with other well supervisors, engineers, and staff from other sections

within the Division. Must be able to compile and summarize data collected in the field and verify GPS coordinates and survey locations using a variety of software including, but not limited to, Microsoft Word, Excel, Access, Outlook, and various mapping software such as All-Topo, Google Earth and other GPS software. Must possess skill in effective written and verbal communication; required skills also include planning, prioritizing, and executing tasks in a timely manner with minimal supervision. Applicants must be highly professional, well-organized, self-motivated and enthusiastic. May be expected to perform additional job-related duties and may be required to have or develop additional specific job-related knowledge and skills. Must have a good driving record and be available for travel (up to 25% of the time) as required.
