The State of Nevada, encompassing over 110,000 square miles, is a land of vast natural beauty, economic diversity, and cultural vibrancy. Known as the "Silver State" for its historic mining legacy, Nevada today is equally recognized for its dynamic cities, rugged outdoor landscapes, and spirit of independence. Anchored by metropolitan hubs like Las Vegas and Reno, Nevada also offers a rich tapestry of rural communities, tribal lands, and open desert that reflect its deep Western roots.

Home to more than 3.2 million residents, Nevada is one of the fastest-growing states in the nation. The state features no personal income tax, a favorable business climate, and year-round recreational opportunities from world-class entertainment and dining to hiking, skiing, and stargazing beneath some of the clearest night skies in the U.S.

With over 300 days of sunshine annually in many regions, Nevada's climate ranges from the dry heat of the Mojave Desert to the four-season beauty of the Sierra Nevada. The state is also home to Lake Tahoe, Great Basin National Park, Red Rock Canyon, and more than 800,000 acres of state park land.

The Nevada Financial Institutions Division's mission is to maintain integrity of the financial institutions system for the citizens of Nevada that is safe and sound, protects consumers and defends the overall public interest, and promotes economic development through the efficient, effective and equitable licensing, examination and supervision of depository, fiduciary, and non-depository financial institutions.

VISION STATEMENT:

Safeguard Nevada's financial institutions system to sustain a safe and sound and compliant financial environment to protect Nevadans and promote economic development in a progressive, proactive, and service oriented manner.

The Division is responsible for the licensing, examination, and regulatory supervision of depository, fiduciary, and non-depository institutions in Nevada. The Division upholds the integrity of the financial system by enforcing applicable state and federal laws under NRS Titles 52, 54, and 55. The Division actively monitors and adapts to emerging technologies and evolving regulatory standards to ensure effective oversight and compliance.

The ideal candidate is an ethical and strategic leader with a strong background in financial institution regulation and oversight.

Demonstrate effective conflict resolution skills, adaptability, and uphold a high level of integrity in all aspects of their work. They must be flexible, possess excellent problem-solving abilities, and exhibit strong verbal and written communication skills. A collaborative mindset, exceptional interpersonal skills, and a willingness to learn and grow are essential for success in this role.

WHAT YOU'LL BE DOING:

The Deputy Administrator supports the Administrator in overseeing the Division's regulatory functions. Key responsibilities include:managing daily operations and supervising a statewide team of 48 staff, administering and enforcing the provisions of NRS/NAC Chapters, overseeing licensing, examinations, investigations, and the rulemaking process, developing policies, procedures, and agency budgets, and representing the Division in public forums, legislative hearings, and industry events. The incumbent will also be leading initiatives in IT oversight and cryptocurrency regulation as well as building partnerships with local, state, and federal agencies.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Minimum five years of progressively responsible experience in financial institutions or regulatory oversight. Administration and management of key functional areas such as audit, compliance, safety and soundness examinations, risk management. Knowledge in cybersecurity, cryptocurrency, and digital assets.
