**NEVADA DEPUTY ATTORNEY
FOR INJURED WORKERS**

RECRUITMENT OPEN TO:

This is an open-competitive recruitment, open to all qualified applicants. This position is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the Nevada Attorney for Injured Workers (NAIW), within the Department of Business and Industry.

AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES:

NAIW takes cases by appointment of administrative appeals officers adjudicating claims for injured workers seeking benefits under Nevada's Industrial Insurance Act (NRS 616A-D) and Occupational Disease Act (NRS 617). These cases start with litigation in administrative hearings, with possible review in the district courts, and appeal to the Supreme Court of Nevada.

APPROXIMATE ANNUAL SALARY:

Up to \$108,753, plus benefits * (*Salary reflects retirement (PERS) contributions by both the employee and employer. An employer paid contribution plan is also available with a reduced gross salary.*)

BENEFITS:

The State benefits package includes a retirement system, paid health, vision, dental, life and disability insurance; 11 paid holidays, and paid sick and annual leave. Other employee paid benefits such as deferred compensation plans are also available.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

Deputy attorneys in the agency take direct responsibility for developing and presenting evidence at formal administrative hearings and, if necessary, brief the district courts and the Supreme Court on appeal. The deputy attorney position requires direct contact with numerous clients, review of large amounts of medical evidence, and presenting testimony at frequent but short evidentiary hearings. Excellent legal research and writing skills are expected to create district court review of appeals officer's decisions and appeals to the Supreme Court, if necessary.

TO QUALIFY:

Must be an attorney licensed to practice in Nevada. Exemplary interpersonal skills working with staff and dealing directly with clients in need of representation is required. Given the number of

cases each deputy attorney is assigned, the ability to multi-task is also required. Incumbents must have the ability to marshal the evidence available and apply the statutes and cases on point for the client's success and be comfortable in the evidentiary hearing setting when carrying the client's burden of proof.

POSITION LOCATION: Currently, there are two vacant positions in Carson City, Nevada and two vacant positions in Las Vegas, Nevada.
