RECRUITING FOR: A full-time, unclassified position within the Division of Child and Family Services Administration, located in either Las Vegas, Reno, or Carson City, Nevada depending upon the needs of the Division and the candidate selected. Sunshine and recreational opportunities are abundant throughout the state to include skiing, golfing, biking, off-roading, hiking, fishing, and hunting and the area blends a mix of old-fashioned charm and history with modern cultural opportunities. Nevada offers community choices in high-energy city, peaceful suburban and quaint rural settings; excellent educational options for students in K-12, community colleges and universities; world-class entertainment and cultural events and unparalleled outdoor recreation opportunities.

The Nevada Division of Child and Family Services is seeking qualified applicants for the position of Deputy Administrator, Quality and Oversight. This is an unclassified position within Nevada State Government and is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the Administrator of the Division of Child and Family Services.

The Deputy position is responsible for the leadership, direction, and administration of the division's quality and oversight functions including child welfare, juvenile justice, children's mental health systems, and the Systems Advocate. The Family Programs Office provides oversight and support to the child welfare agencies including program development and oversight, and compliance with state and federal requirements, and continuous quality improvement. The Juvenile Justice Programs Office provides monitoring and support of Nevada's juvenile justice system including managing federal and state grant funds, policy and program development, compliance with state and federal law, and quality assurance. The Children's Mental Health Planning and Evaluation Unit provides quality oversight and support for public and private children's mental and behavioral health providers and engages in quality assurance activities to support systems improvement. The Systems Advocate unit assists community members and stakeholders with requests for information, system complaints and serves as the Division's Public Information Officer. The overarching mission of DCFS is to focus and support on systems quality improvement for Nevada's children and families.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE: A Bachelor's degree or Master's degree with major course work in social work, psychology, criminal justice, business administration, public administration, or other field related to health and human services. The preferred candidate will have a minimum of 3 years successful

management and leadership experience administering a comprehensive quality and oversight for children and families; demonstrate knowledge and experience in the law, theories, and principles related to children's services; program planning, development, and evaluation; public administration to include policy development and administration of a complex budget; the legislative process to include working cooperatively with legislators and supporting legislation, programs, and budgets before legislative committees; collaborating with governmental and private entities and families to develop and implement programs and services; OR an equivalent combination of education and experience.

In addition to critical leadership skills, the ideal candidate for the Deputy Administrator of Quality and Oversight has experience in either regulatory analysis and compliance or systems change analysis, planning and action. An experienced program leader, auditor, or quality assurance professional is a likely candidate. A proven record of identifying issues, root cause analyses, and planning thoughtful responses is preferred.
